#### **Pyramid Triangle Foundation: Triangles in Triangles**

*Finished Foundation: 7" by 8"*

*Finished Quilt: 11 1/2" by 12 1/2"*

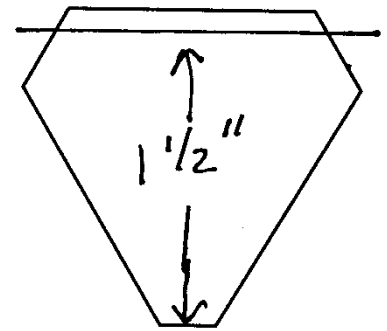

- Please note this very important correction you will need to make to the pyramid triangle patch template pattern:

**Pyramid Triangle patch template pattern** (on the foundation sheet pullout)

The template is just slightly off size. To fix, line up your ruler on the 1 1/2" mark on the short line that is just above the wording "Pyramid Triangle patch template pattern." Draw a line across the top of the template at the 1 1/2" mark. This is the line you should use when tracing your template. Please note: it is important that you place the correction line as indicated (and not along any of the other template edges).

**The illustration is intended only as a visual guide for where you should draw your correction. It is NOT a patch template drawn to size.**

#### **Fabric Requirements:**

The border and binding fabrics require some minimal yardage. The patches for the foundation require scraps (see the cutting directions for the strip lengths and number of patches needed).

#### *For the foundation:*

Medium to dark brightly colored batiks – a collection of scraps (I used 24 different fabrics)

Light colored batiks – a collection of scraps (I used approximately 15 different fabrics)

Dark fabric for the inner border and binding: 1/8 yard

Border: 1/4 yard

Backing: 1 fat quarter

**Cutting Directions:** Patch Size – Cut a 1 1/2" by 2" rectangle for each patch. **Use the Pyramid Triangle Patch template to trim the rectangles to size.**

*From the medium to dark fabrics:*

For 12 of the fabrics (A – L), cut a strip 1 1/2" by 6" – crosscut into 3 patches, 1 1/2" by 2".

For 12 of the fabrics (A2 – L2), cut a single patch, 1 1/2" by 2".

*From the light colored fabrics:*

For 8 of the fabrics (2, 3, 6, 7, 10, 11, 14, 15), cut a strip 1 1/2" by 6" – crosscut into 3 patches.

For 8 of the fabrics (1, 4, 5, 8, 9, 12, 13, 16), cut a strip 1 1/2" by 4" – crosscut into 2 patches.

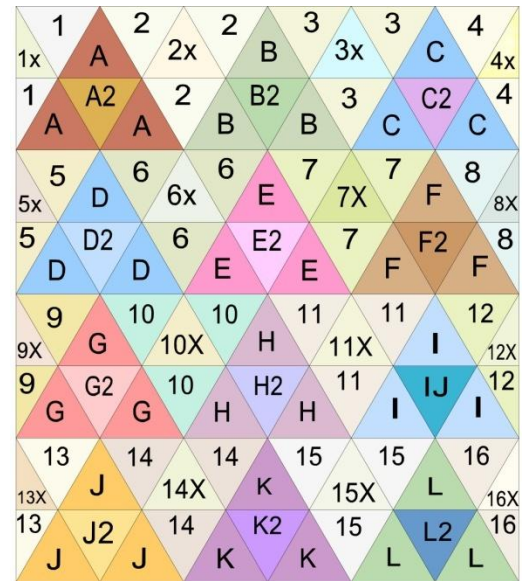
For 16 of the fabrics (1x – 16x), cut a single patch, 1 1/2" by 2".

*Inner Border:* Cut 2 strips 3/4" by 7 1/2"

Cut 2 strips 3/4" by 9"

*Outer Border:* Cut 2 strips 2 1/4" by 8"

Cut 2 strips 2 1/4" by 12 1/2"



**Quilt Layout Diagram Oddity – Or why the accent center triangle for the "I" triangle is identified as "IJ" instead of "I2":** Well, "I2" (eye-two) looks an awful lot like "12" (twelve). Ask me how I know. Labeling the patch "IJ" should avoid any (really annoying) confusion as to which patch goes where!
